

## Summary Sheet on Lead Violation Initiative

---

The Baltimore City Health Department – Healthy Homes Division is introducing a new initiative to help homebuyers and renters reduce lead risks to children.

At the start of Lead Poisoning Prevention Week, the Health Department will post the addresses of recent lead hazard violations that have not been fixed.

The posting is not a definitive list of all the properties in Baltimore City with lead hazards.

Only those properties that have been inspected by the Lead Poisoning Prevention Program are listed. Specifically, this list includes all lead hazard violations issued or re-issued by the Baltimore City Health Department between January 1, 2006 and July 31, 2007 that have not been fixed as of October 1, 2007.

The list of violations posted on the website will be updated quarterly. Recent additions or changes to the list can be obtained by calling the Childhood Lead Prevention Program at 443-984-2460.
